

**Peachwood Recreation Plan According
to the New Jersey Department of Health Guidelines**

I. Staffing and Pool Facility Operations

- A. Train and equip the following personnel on COVID-19 awareness, cleaning and sanitizing to perform their assigned duties in a manner that promotes the safety of public and staff. Document dates and times facility was cleaned.
- B. Discuss with staff the procedure in reporting all Covid-19 questions and concerns. This will be reported to the Pool Manager on duty.
- C. Where applicable have Lifeguards provide expired certification AND the extension certificate as acceptable documentation.
- D. Take temperature readings of staff entering the facility and documenting information. Staff that have a fever of 100.4° or above or other signs of COVID-19 illness will not be admitted to the facilities.
- E. Train staff to screen for fever or signs of COVID-19 illness at designated entry points.
- F. Implement of an ambassador role to monitor and encourage social distancing of staff, swimmers, coaches and parents. This shall be the head manager of Peachwood Recreation Club.
- G. Implement a Covid-19 contact person to follow proper protocol outlined in the N.J. Department of Health Guidelines. This shall be the head manager of Peachwood Recreation Club.
- H. Develop reporting procedures in the event of non-compliance with any activities required by the Executive Order No. 153 (2020). This shall be the head manager of Peachwood Recreation Club.
- I. Restrictions and Expectations about Covid-19 will be posted on our Peachwood Recreation Club website. This actual document will be available for everyone to utilize.

II. Admittance and Access to the Facility

- A. Designate specific entry and exit points to facility bathing area to avoid congregation.
- B. Post signage that staff, coaches, swimmers and parents should be on the alert for signs of illness and to stay home when they have symptoms of COVID-19 or are otherwise sick.
- C. Reduce capacity to 50% of the maximum capacity for the facility and grounds at one time.
- Peachwoods facility and grounds capacity is 371
At 50% capacity the club will allow a total of 186 staff members, coaches, swimmers and parents to enter the club daily.
 - Peachwoods main pool is 3,444 square feet with the capacity of 123.
At 50% capacity the club will allow 61 swimmers in the pool at a time.

D. Designate team, practice and parent team building areas that follow social distancing guidelines. When implementing these activities coaches will be sure to group together family units or people that quarantined together. Sanitation will take place after each activity to ensure cleanliness and abide by guidelines.

E. Maintain a sign in sheet for all staff and parents to facilitate potential contact tracing efforts. Coaches will maintain an attendance sheet for swimmers to facilitate potential contact tracing efforts.

III. Infection Control Strategies

- A. Establish procedures for safely removing anyone showing signs and symptoms of COVID-19 consistent with CDC guidance.
- B. Develop and implement enhanced cleaning and disinfection procedures using approved disinfectants and following CDC guidance that includes frequent cleaning and disinfecting of high traffic areas and major touch points.
- C. Provide sanitizer stations throughout the pool facility and ensure there are enough quantity of cleaning supplies available.
- D. Prohibit the use of club furniture (EX: deck chairs, lounge chairs, and umbrellas) and allow coaches, swimmers and parents to bring their own chairs and maintain 6 feet of social distancing outside of family units or people who were not quarantined together.

Family units consist of family members, caretakers, household members, or romantic partners.

- E. Allow lifeguard certification training to utilize the pavilion and tables as long as trainees are maintaining the 6 feet social distancing. Peachwood will Sanitize the pavilion and any tables used after the training is over.
- F. Allow swimmers to use their own water equipment such as goggles, boards, fins, etc. Prohibit the sharing of any equipment. The club will not provide any equipment for use.

V. Restrooms and Shower Access

A. Require foot coverings within restroom. (Signs will be posted) Maximum 2 people in restroom at a time. (Signs will be posted) Showers will remain closed. (Signs will be posted) No changing will be permitted in restrooms. (Signs will be posted) 6ft distance will be labeled on the ground for social distance.

B. Signs will be posted in bathrooms reminding people to wash and sanitize.

C. Shift supervisor will monitor restrooms to remind people of the limit allowed and to socially distance from each other.

V. Face Masks, Gloves, and Social Distancing Strategies

A. Staff, swimmers upon entrance and exit, coaches and parents will be encouraged to wear a cloth face covering while not in the pool when social distancing of 6 feet cannot be maintained.

Cloth face coverings will NOT be put on children under age two because of the danger of suffocation.

Face coverings will NOT be allowed in the water due to increased risk of drowning.

Lifeguards will NOT wear a face covering while on duty actively lifeguarding. It will be encouraged that lifeguards wear a cloth face covering when they are not on duty actively lifeguarding and cannot maintain social distancing of 6 feet.

B. Proper and frequent hand washing is required by staff. Gloves will be worn when cleaning or sanitizing. Peachwood will supply staff with face coverings and gloves if needed.

VI. Social Distancing

A. Encouraging 6 feet social distancing on the pool deck and other used area except within Family units or people who quarantined together.

B. Control entrance and exit flow using visible markings and postings or signage

C. Post signs that denote six feet of spacing in all commonly used areas.

D. Place visual markings 6ft meet apart for swimmers to utilize for belongings and their own area while waiting to start practice and when completing practice.

VII. Communication Plan

B. Pool facilities will post signage at entrance and on employee board indicating that:

Face coverings are strongly encouraged

Face coverings should NOT be worn in the water (increases the risk of drowning)

Hands should be washed frequently with soap and water

Do not touch your face (especially eyes, nose or mouth) with unwashed hands

Stay home if you are sick

Practice social distancing and avoid large gatherings

VIII. Emergency Evacuation Procedure

- A. Train and discuss the evacuation procedure with staff to ensure the safety of all staff, swimmers, coaches and parents if emergency exit is needed.
